- the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity - the Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that all children and young people aged 5 to 18 engage in at least 60 minutes of physical activity a day, of which 30 minutes should be in school
- the profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole-school improvement
- broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
- increased participation in competitive sport

Costs must be assigned against one of the following centres for the sports premium return:

- **CPD:** External training courses, Upskilling for swimming, Internal learning and development, Inter-school development, Online training and resource development, External coaches supporting confidence
- **Internal Activities:** School-based extra-curriculars, Internal sports comps, Top-up swimming, Active travel, Equipment and resources, Membership fees, Use of platforms and resources
- **External Activities:** Activities organised by School Games organiser network, Other inter-school sports competitions, External coaching staff

The funding each school receives is derived from the January census for Y1 to Y6 pupils. Croftway Academy was allocated £19,300 in the financial year 2025 - 2026.
